Param Vir Chakra



The medal is a circular bronze disc 1.375 inches (34.9 mm) in diameter. On the obverse, the National Emblem of India appears in the centre on a raised circle surrounded by four copies of the vajra, the mythical weapon of Indra, the ancient Vedic king of the gods. The motif symbolizes the sacrifice of Rishi Dadhichi, who gave his bones to the gods to make the vajra to kill the demon Vritra.

The medal is suspended from a straight-swivelling suspension bar. On the reverse, around a plain centre, are two legends separated by lotus flowers. The words 'Param Vir Chakra' are written in Hindi and English. A purple ribbon, 32 millimetres (1.3 in) long, holds the Param Vir Chakra. The medal is cast in bronze.

It was designed by Yvonne Maday de Maros who married an army officer Vikram Khanolkar, took Indian citizenship and became Savitri Khanolkar. Soon after Independence, the army's Adjutant General, Major-General Hiralal Atal, asked her to design the PVC medal.

Param Vir Chakra (PVC) translates as the 'Wheel of the Ultimate Brave', and the award is granted for "most conspicuous bravery in the face of the enemy". In India's official order of precedence, the PVC is second only to the Bharat Ratna.

The 21 PVC awardees are the men of steel who for their acts of supreme and selfless bravery, were bestowed with the nation's highest wartime gallantry honour. Of the 21 awardees, 14 were awarded PVC posthumously, while 16 of the medals were related to Indo-Pak conflicts. The Indian Army received 20 of the awards, while one was conferred to the Indian Air Force. The Infantry received 17, the highest number of PVCs. The Grenadiers and the Gorkha Rifles regiments of the Indian Army have received three PVCs each.

Major Somnath Sharma

4 Kumaon Regiment | Badgam, Kashmir | Nov. 3, 1948

Major Somnath Sharma, leading hundred soldiers, was martyred in a heroic last-ditch battle near Srinagar airfield against 700 Pathan invaders from Pakistan. Major Sharma, though grievously injured, staved off enemy attacks on Badgam aerodrome and Srinagar. For his gallantry, tenacious defence and exemplary leadership that inspired his men to take the enemy head on, inspite of being outnumbered seven to one, won valuable time to fly in more soldiers and save Srinagar. A grateful nation recognised his bravery with the nation's highest gallantry award – The PVC. He was the first recipient of the PVC, when it was instituted on India's first Republic Day, 26th January, 1950.

Naik Jadunath Singh

1 Rajput Regiment | Taindhara, Naushera, Kashmir

Feb. 6, 1948

Naik Jadunath Singh was commanding a section with very limited resources and defended Tain Dhar when thousands of Pakistani raiders launched an offensive to capture Naushera. But Naik Jadunath Singh though battered and bleeding, yet completely unmindful of his own safety, encouraged his men to fight and battle valiantly and turned the tide of the battle till he was felled by an enemy bullet. He saved Naushera and displayed unparalleled bravery. For his gallant action in the face of the enemy, he was honoured posthumously with the PVC.

Second Lieutenant Rama Raghoba Rane

Bombay Engineers | Naushera-Rajouri Road | April, 1948

Second Lieutenant Rane and his section was part of the forces tasked to capture Barwali ridge from the Pakistani Army but was prevented due to massive road blocks and minefields on the road. Despite being injured and risking his life, he drove to the roadblock in a tank, crouched under it, and cleared the mines, thus helping the tanks to move ahead and finally reach Rajouri. The Bombay Engineers were awarded the battle honour of Rajouri and Second Lieutenant Rane the PVC for his devotion to duty, courage and gallantry, one of the rare men who wore a PVC while being alive.

Company Haviladar Major Piru Singh Shekhawat

6 Rajputana Rifles | The Battle of Darapari, J&K | July, 1948

Company Haviladar Major Piru Singh and his men were tasked to capture Darapari. The Pakistani Army defended their position with ferocity and Piru Singh fully unmindful of his own safety, dashed to the nearest bunker to neutralise the enemy soldiers. Only one left in his section, he rushed through the effective fire and was hit with a bullet but he managed to lob the grenade into the enemy bunker. As Piru Singh lay breathing his last on the ridge of Darapari, he watched the bunker collapse silencing the medium machine gun inside. For his unmatched bravery, inspiring example and superhuman courage in the face of the enemy, Company Haviladar Major Piru Singh was awarded the PVC, posthumously.

Lance Naik Karam Singh

1 Sikh Regiment | Tithwal sector, J&K | Oct. 13, 1948

Lance Naik Karam Singh was commanding an outpost when the Pakistanis launched a desperate attack to win back the area they had lost to the Indian Army. Unmindful of his grievous injuries, Lance Naik Karam Singh held on even when the enemy mortar fire and shelling destroyed every single bunker of the platoon. Moving from bunker to bunker, he motivated his tired men to fight bravely. He did not let the spirit of the soldiers dampen even though the enemy launched one attack after another. Lance Naik Karam Singh was awarded the PVC for his devotion to duty and bravery beyond comparison. He is the first soldier to receive it while being alive.

Captain Gurbachan Singh Salaria

3/1 Gorkha Rifles | Elizabethville, Congo | Dec. 5, 1961

Part of the UN Force, Captain Gurbachan Singh Salaria and his men were tasked to clear a roadblock put up by the Gendarmerie. Captain Salaria charged at the Gendarmerie, wreaking havoc on the battlefield. Captain Salaria was hit and though profusely bleeding, he scattered a large group of enemy soldiers and made them flee while facing his tiny group of Gorkhas. Captain Gurbachan Singh Salaria breathed his last living up to the motto the Gorkha Rifles, 'It is better to die than be a coward'. For his leadership, courage, unflinching devotion to duty with complete disregard for personal safety, Captain Gurbachan Singh Salaria was posthumously awarded the PVC.

Major Dhan Singh Thapa

8 Gorkha Rifles | Ladakh Region | Oct. 20, 1962

The battle that took place at Sirijap in Ladakh is immortalized in military history for the dynamic leadership of Major Dhan Singh Thapa. Vastly outnumbered, the Gorkhas put up a brave fight and created havoc in the attacking Chinese force. Under intense enemy fire, he courageously went around bunkers unmindful of his own safety, strengthening breaches, replacing men who had died or were injured and encouraging the remaining by personal example. Major Thapa was one of the last few left alive when he was surrounded and taken prisoner. He was given up for dead. For his devotion to duty, undaunted gallantry and inspiring command, Major Thapa was awarded the PVC posthumously. But, he returned from the dead. Major Thapa rose to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and served till he retired.

Subedar Joginder Singh

1 Sikh Regiment | Tawang, Arunachal | Oct 20-23, 1962

A platoon of 1 Sikh Regiment commanded by Subedar Joginder Singh lived exactly the way he asked his men to fight 'like a lion'. He with his 29 men by his side took on a brigade strength of Chinese troops in Bum La. He inspired his soldiers to continue to fight even after their ammunition ran out and they fought the Chinese with their bayonets. Subedar Joginder Singh, the brave Sikh soldier, immobilised by his injuries, lay on the Bum La axis, and was carried away by the Chinese, where he died in captivity. His body was never returned. When the Chinese heard that the Indian government has awarded the PVC to Subedar Joginder Singh, they reverently returned his ashes.

Major Shaitan Singh

13 Kumaon Regiment | Rezang La, Chusul sector,
Ladakh | Nov. 18, 1962

Major Shaitan Singh and his soldiers, were tasked to defend Rezang La, against the Chinese Army. They fought to the last against overwhelming odds; a tale of handful of brave men under his leadership fought valiantly to save their post from falling into enemy hands. Badly hurt, during the battle, he succumbed to his injuries. Major Shaitan Singh's supreme courage, leadership and exemplary devotion to duty encouraged his men to fight gallantly to the end defending their country's honour. For this act of undaunted valour in the face of the enemy, he was awarded with the PVC posthumously. Major Shaitan Singh and his men lay frozen at Rezang La, till their bodies were discovered three months later.



Lieutenant Colonel A B Tarapore

17 Poona Horse | Phillora, Sialkot, Pakistan
Sept. 11-16, 1965

Lieutenant Colonel A B Tarapore was leading the tank battle to capture Phillora in 1965 Indo-Pak war. After the capture of Buttar Dograndi, Lieutenant Colonel Tarapore regrouped and gallantly attacked Phillora. Unmindful of his injury, he captured Jassoran and despite the odds, he maintained his pivots helping the supporting infantry to attack Chawinda. Inspired by his leadership, the regiment fiercely attacked and destroyed the enemy tanks in the famous tank battle of Chawinda, where Lieutenant Colonel A B Tarapore of 17 Horse lost his life and was decorated with the PVC posthumously.

Company Quartermaster Havildar Abdul Hamid 4 Grenadiers Regiment | Khem Karan | Sept. 10, 1965

Company Quartermaster Havildar Abdul Hamid and his men armed with recoilless guns faced a brigade-level attack of the Pakistani forces. Company Quartermaster Havildar Abdul Hamid and his brave men fought gallantly and destroyed a total of seven enemy tanks. As he was taking aim to fire, he was hit by a tank shell and was martyred. For his extraordinary feat, bravery and courage, Company Quartermaster Havildar Abdul Hamid was awarded the PVC posthumously.

Lance Naik Albert Ekka

14th Battalion Brigade of the Guards | Gangasagar,
near Agartala | Dec. 4, 1971

Lance Naik Albert Ekka's company was tasked to attack Gangasagar railway station, a which was a virtual fortress of the Pakistan army. He rushed to silence the enemy's fire, coming from a building. Undaunted by the bullet injury to his arm, he crawled ahead and despite being hit again he picked himself up and lobbed a grenade killing one enemy soldier and charged with his bayonet to neutralise another. The machine gun fell silent and the battle turned in favour of the Indian soldiers. Lance Naik Ekka succumbed to his injuries and was awarded the PVC for his heroic deed and supreme sacrifice for the nation.

Flying Officer Nirmaljit Singh Sekhon

Indian Air Force | Srinagar | Dec. 14, 1971

Flying Officer Nirmaljit Singh Sekhon singlehandedly thwarted the attack on Srinagar airfield by a wave of six Pakistani Sabre aircrafts and succeeded in damaging two of them. After a fierce and daring fight at treetop height, the completely outnumbered Sekhon's Gnat aircraft crashed in the Valley. For his exemplary courage and heroism in the Indo-Pakistan War of 1971, Flying Officer Sekhon was posthumously awarded the PVC. He remains the only Air Force personnel to be awarded the country's highest gallantry award.

Second Lieutenant Arun Khetarpal

17 Poona Horse | Basantar, Shakargarh | Dec. 16, 1971

Second Lieutenant Arun Khetarpal seated inside his Centurion battle tank, switched off the radio and continued to fire denying the passage that the enemy was so desperately seeking. He fearlessly attacked the Pakistani tanks and destroyed them. Not one enemy tank got past Second Lieutenant Khetarpal. Seriously wounded he breathed his last. He was only 21. It was an act of courage and self-sacrifice far beyond the call of duty. Second Lieutenant Arun Khetarpal was awarded the PVC for displaying the highest qualities of valour, leadership and strength of purpose.

Major Hoshiar Singh

Grenadiers Regiment | Shakargarh | Dec. 17, 1971

Facing a wave of counter-attacks, Major Hoshiar Singh, despite being injured, rushed to a machine-gun pit and manned the gun himself till the enemy retreated. After the capture of Jarpal across the international border in Pakistan, Major Hoshiar Singh and his troops repulsed a massive attack by the Pakistani troops to recapture it. He displayed personal bravery and dauntless courage, with complete disregard for personal safety in the face of heavy odds, for which he was awarded the PVC. He is one of the rare few to have been honoured with PVC while being alive.

Surrender of Pakistani Armed Forces

Dhaka | Dec. 16, 1971

General Jagjit Singh Aurora, GOC-in-C, Eastern Command, witnessing Lieutenant General A. A. K. Niazi, Martial Law Administrator of East Pakistan, signing the Instrument of Surrender. This written agreement led to the surrender of 93,000 soldiers of the Pakistan Armed Forces on Dec. 16, 1971 at the Ramna Race Course Garden in Dhaka. This is one of the largest military surrenders in world history and the biggest surrender after World War II.

Naib Subedar Bana Singh

Jammu & Kashmir Light Infantry | Siachen | 1987

Naib Subedar Bana Singh and his comrades were tasked to recapture a key peak in the Indian territory in Siachen which the Pakistani forces had surreptitiously occupied. Leading his men through a hazardous route he closed in with the Pakistani infiltrators. Naib Subedar Bana Singh inspired his men with his indomitable courage and personal example to eventually clear the post of all intruders and recaptured it. Naib Subedar Bana Singh was awarded the PVC for his bravery and leadership under the most hostile conditions. The post was renamed as Bana Post.

Major Ramaswamy Parameswaram

Mahar Regiment | Sri Lanka | Nov. 25, 1987

During Operation Pawan, in the hostile territory of Eastern Sri Lanka, Major Ramaswamy Parameswaram's column was ambushed. Despite being severely injured, he counter attacked saving many lives and continued to fight bravely till his last breath. For his gallantry, exemplary leadership and command, Major Ramaswamy Parameswaram was awarded posthumously the nation's highest gallantry award, the PVC.

1/11 Gorkha Rifles | Kargil | July 2-3, 1999

Lieutenant Manoj Kumar Pandey volunteered to retrieve the bodies of his fellow soldiers who were sent to reconnoitre the occupied heights and brutally killed by the enemy. He successfully accomplished the task. His battalion was then assigned to force back the intruders from Batalik and recapture Jaubar Top. The battalion's bid to recapture Khalubar was halted by enemy fire but Lieutenant Pandey surged ahead through hail of bullets to engage the enemy. He was mortally wounded and collapsed only after the last of the enemies had been silenced. For his act of daring and exemplary bravery, Lieutenant Pandey was honoured with the PVC.

Grenadier Yogendra Singh Yadav

18 Grenadiers Regiment | Kargil | July 3-4, 1999

Tasked to capture Tiger Hill bunkers, Grenadier Yogendra Singh Yadav, despite being hit by three bullets, climbed the remaining 60 feet to an enemy bunker at the top of Tiger Hill and lobbed a grenade, killing four enemy soldiers and thus neutralising the enemy fire. He held his own against a company-strength of Pakistani soldiers and later managed to reach back to his battalion. His individual act of bravery contributed immensely to the re-capturing of Tiger Hill. For his indomitable and daring courage Grenadier Yadav was honoured with the PVC.

Captain Vikram Batra

13 Jammu & Kashmir Rifles | Kargil | July 7, 1999

Captain Vikram Batra during the Kargil war, engaged three Pakistani soldiers in close combat and killed them as his Delta Company recaptured Point 5140 before overrunning enemy posts at Point 4750 and Point 4875. He was killed by enemy fire as he tried to rescue a fellow officer. His famous radioed message, from a height of 18,000 feet, "Yeh Dil Maange More", caught the fancy of millions of Indians. For acts of daring and unparalleled bravery, a grateful nation conferred him with the highest military honour, the PVC.

An indebted motherland pays homage to the daring soldiers whose indomitable courage and valour ensured protection of the nation's sovereignty. Their saga of selfless sacrifice will continue to inspire new generations of soldiers.
